

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### Meet The New ACC-SRAVTE Director



On December 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023 Dr. Shane Lange was officially approved as the new ACC/SRAVTE Director starting for the 2024-25 school Year. Dr. Lange will officially assume his position starting July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. Dr. Langes' approval was two-fold as the SRAVTE/ACC Boards of control approved him in a special meeting on December 19<sup>th</sup>, and the LPHS School board affirmed that appointment on December 20<sup>th</sup>. Currently Dr. Lange works as the Dean of Workforce **Development at Illinois Valley** Community College. Dr. Lange brings a wealth of educational as well as private sector experience with him in this transition to the Directorship. Dr. Lange started his educational journey at Illinois Valley Community College, and then moved on to Southern Illinois University in Carbondale. In that time he worked in industry for the automotive, insurance, and manufacturing sectors. Not finding his ultimate love with those career paths he decided that he wanted to help others the way his teachers had helped him. With that he went back to school to become a teacher. Dr. Lange later spent some time teaching junior high Science, and then moved on to teach Automotive Technologies at Illinois Valley before becoming the Dean of Workforce Development. To finish his educational degree pursuit, he received a Master's from the University of Massachusetts and his Educational Doctorate from Illinois State University.

Dr. Lange brings a passion for the CTE end of education, and has great respect for the CTE instructors and the skill sets (as well as work-place acumen) that they impart to their students. In his current role he has made many visits to the ACC and those trips have continuously added to his respect for the facilities and its employees. He sees his love for CTE as adding to the growing enthusiasm from the public and industry partners for what the ACC has to offer.

Going forward as the next director, Dr. Lange is very excited to do work in improving Career Pathways for students and to use his leadership skills to foster trust and collegial collaboration. 


### ACC Alum Gets Her Wings

LPHS and ACC alumni Catherine Engels (Class of 22), credits the ACC Aviation program with whetting her appetite for a love of flying. Having had no experience in Aviation, Catherine saw the ACC program as a perfect opportunity to get started. In taking the class (as well using its introductory flights), Catherine decided a further pursuit of an Aviation career was the path she would take, with the ultimate goal being to become an airline pilot. Catherine stated: "I chose this path because I traveled a lot as a child and I was always inspired by the pilot's ability to fly a huge aircraft from one place to the other. Traveling was also something I was interested in, so flying for an airline would allow me to travel across the country and the world."

There is also a secondary motivation that Catherine holds dear in her pursuit of becoming an airline pilot. That motivation is the advocacy for greater involvement of women in the Aviation industry. In an industry that is dominated by males, Catherine is hopeful that she adds to the importance of having women in bigger roles like instructors and/or captains. Having more / women in those roles is impactful for younger people (herself included) so they see that it is possible to succeed as far as you can dream. She reflects that as a woman "it was intimidating to have all male instructors and classmates at first, but having one female instructor was really amazing for me. Having other women around to support and guide you helps you feel less alone and creates a close community." In completing her training, and earning her private pilots license, Catherine has taken the first step in supporting this advocacy.

Catherine advises that when one takes up a pursuit of their goal they shouldn't compare themselves to others. One should trust their gut and understand that if it is worthwhile, it wont be easy. However, in the end, the payoff will be similar to what she felt when she flew solo "As often as it's said, it's true when I say there are no words. It was a nervous, exciting, exhilarating, adrenaline rushed feeling. Having full control of the plane felt powerful. It also took my mind a while to process that it happened." The ACC is very Proud of you Catherine and Congratulations on this huge success in achieving a goal and pursuit of your career!!


